



**Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration regulations require that drivers holding a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) must certify their driving category to the Idaho Transportation Department. Before going to the self-certification site determine your driving category.**

## Determine if you need a medical card:

Is the commodity you are hauling regulated?



You are required to have a medical card.

Is the commodity you are hauling exempt from FMCSA regulations?



You may not be required to have a medical card. See exemptions below.

**Under certain circumstances, drivers in the following categories may be exempt from the medical card requirement but NOT from commercial licensing requirements, according to FMCSA regulations. The list below is a general guide:**
