Summary:

At 1:03 p.m. -The meeting began with Idaho Transportation Department employee introductions.

From 1:04 p.m. to 1:10 p.m. - Brendan Floyd and Brian Goeke described the rule edits, explaining that most rules are under review due to the governor's Zero-Based Regulation (ZBR) effort. The department stated that the emphasis while reviewing these rules was to eliminate unnecessary language. Two exceptions to the ZBR review schedule were IDAPA 39.02.04 and 39.02.76. Rule 39.02.04 prescribes vehicle dealer and manufacturer hearing processes. The department explained these process were no longer necessary due to new legislation 2023. The modifications to rule 39.02.76 were also prompted by new legislation allowing for commercial driver's license holders to renew their licenses online. Additional modifications to this rule allow for overall broader allowances for online driver's license and identification card renewals.

At 1:10 p.m. - Alicia Hunter asked for confirmation that this year's DMV rule changes only sought to allow for online CDL renewals and otherwise were being reviewed in order to follow the governor's Red Tape Reduction Act. Brendan Floyd confirmed this was the case.

At 1:15 p.m. - Carlie Foster joined the call, stating she was representing the Idaho Trucking Association and was there to see if anyone had a comments on rules that may impact the association. She stated she had no input at that time. Colby Cameron stated that if we receive any comments the department would create a rulemaking record and post it to the ITD website

At 1:17 p.m. – Floyd stated that the group would pause the event but continue to monitor new arrivals and address additional questions.

At 4:00 pm. – The meeting concluded.
