

Idaho's Parent-Student On-Road Driver's Training Program



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PURPOSE

This checklist outlines the steps to complete the Idaho's Parent-Student On-Road Driver's Training program.

- _____ 1. Obtain a permit – Make sure to bring all required documents listed below with you:
 - _____ a. Certified original copy of birth certificate, marriage certificate (for stepparents), or court ordered guardianship document to establish relationship to parent(s) or guardian(s) providing instruction.
 - _____ b. If not previously provided to establish instructor relationship, certified original copy of birth certificate (available from the Bureau of Vital Statistics)
 - _____ c. Acceptable photo identification (Note: Applicants under 18 may have a parent/guardian provide their own photo identification on the applicant's behalf)
 - _____ d. Social Security Card or Number for verification
 - _____ e. Liability Signer (if under 18) – (parent or court-ordered guardian)
 - _____ f. Verification of School Compliance (VOC) (if under 18)
 - _____ g. Acceptable Lawful Presence Documents (if applicable)
- _____ 2. Sign up for an approved online driver training course. A list of approved driver training courses can be found on the [State Department of Education's website](#).
- _____ 3. Complete 30 hours of classroom instruction provided by an approved source. Any classroom instruction provided from an unapproved source will not be accepted.
- _____ 4. Complete and [log](#) 6 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction.
- _____ 5. Complete and [log](#) 6 hours of in-car observation.
- _____ 6. Submit proof of completion from an approved classroom driver training provider and a completed official drive log to Idaho Transportation Department or your local DMV office. This establishes the applicant's test eligibility date. If desired, bring this checklist with you to record the test eligibility date below for later reference.
- _____ 7. Complete a [supervised driving period](#) of 50 hours (10 hours of which must be at night) over a 6 month period. The student must be supervised by a person over the age of 21 that possesses a valid driver's license.
- _____ 8. Meet the requirements for driver's license issuance:
 - _____ a. Applicants must schedule an appointment with a skills tester and pass the skills test.*
*A current skills tester list is available at all county driver's license offices or on our [website](#).
 - _____ b. Applicants must pass the written knowledge test. *
*Applicants who fail a test must wait at least **three days** before retaking a test (the test fees must be re-paid). Tests taken and passed during the three-day waiting period will be considered invalid and not accepted.
 - _____ c. A parent or legal guardian must sign and date a statement that verifies these requirements are completed and that they grant permission to issue the license. This prevents teens from receiving a license before they are eligible and/or without their parent's knowledge and consent.

Note: This is the earliest date an applicant is eligible for driver's license testing after successful completion of a minimum 6-month supervised instruction period. Knowledge or skills tests taken before the test eligibility date will be considered invalid and will not be accepted and will require a new knowledge and/or skills test be purchased and passed.
